

Things to do in Norfolk

- Located along the downtown Norfolk waterfront is **Nauticus**, a hands-on science and technology center exploring the power of the sea. Nauticus features more than 150 exhibits, films on giant screens and touch pools you can even pet a shark if you dare!! Housed inside of the complex is the **Hampton Roads Naval Museum**. This museum is dedicated to the study of 225 years of naval history in the Hampton Roads region. A large section of the gallery is dedicated to events in Hampton Roads during the American Civil War. The Naval Museum is free and open to the public. Docked adjacent to the Naval Museum is the **Battleship Wisconsin**, the last and largest Battleship ever constructed by the U.S. Navy! www.nauticus.org
- The MacArthur Memorial is located in the heart of downtown and serves as the final resting place for five-star General of the Army, Douglas MacArthur and his wife. This museum is located inside downtown Norfolk's restored 1850's City Hall. This free museum contains extensive collections of military and personal artifacts. **Complimentary admission http://www.macarthurmemorial.org/
- ▶ Historic Ghent, named for the Treaty of Ghent that ended the War of 1812, was created as the first suburb of Norfolk. This charming area will take you back in time. Located just a short taxi ride from downtown Norfolk, Ghent offers turn-of-the-century architecture, outdoor eateries, antique dealers, boutiques and chef owned and operated dining options.
- The Chrysler Museum of Art recently reopened after a multi-million dollar renovation. Walter Chrysler, Jr., scion of the automotive company founder, donated nearly 10,000 objects as part of an arrangement where the Norfolk Academy of Arts and Sciences became the Chrysler Museum of Art. Tour the stately Moses Myers House and its peerless collection that creates an exceptionally accurate picture of the late Federal period and the life of a prosperous Jewish family. Passing through several generations, the house began to be restored to its original beauty in 1892. - Located adjacent to the Norfolk International Airport is the **Norfolk Botanical Garden**. The Garden includes more than 20 themed gardens encompassing 155 beautiful acres. Theme gardens include the Butterfly Garden, Sarah Lee Baker Perennial Garden and the Four Seasons Garden. Open 365 days a year, the Garden is one of the only botanical gardens that can be toured by shuttle, tram and boat! Group tours can be arranged in advance by contacting the Gardens.

- Naval Station Norfolk is the largest naval installation in the world and offers 45 minute bus tours conducted by Naval personnel. Norfolk is the homeport to more than 75 ships and 100 aircraft of the Atlantic fleet. Naval Station Norfolk, also known as the Norfolk Navy Base, occupies about four miles (6 km) of waterfront space and seven miles (11 km) of pier and wharf space of the Hampton Roads peninsula known as Sewell's Point. It is the world's largest Naval Station, supporting 75 ships and 134 aircraft alongside 14 piers and 11 aircraft hangars, and houses the largest concentration of U.S. Navy forces. Port Services controls more than 3,100 ships' movements annually as they arrive and depart their berths. Bus tours are available at the office; private buses can tour as well. Contact the office to arrange these.

- Enjoy lunch, dinner, or a wine flight at the **Mermaid Winery**, Norfolk's first winery and Virginia's first urban winery. All of the Mermaid Winery's wine is made using Virginia grapes. Relax along a tree-lined riverbank at the **Hermitage Foundation Museum**. This early 20th century historic home appears frozen in time, offering visitors an extraordinary trip through antiquity. - Nestled on the Elizabeth River is **Harbor Park**, proud home of the **Norfolk Tides**, the Triple-A Affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles baseball team. Harbor Park is a 12,067 seat stadium that boasts 20 luxury suites, press facilities, including two TV broadcasting booths, and a 300-seat restaurant. Getting Around

- The Paddlewheel Ferry is the fastest and most convenient way to travel between Norfolk and Portsmouth. The Ferry leaves from behind Waterside Festival Marketplace.

- Not feeling up to the walk? Call **F.R.E.D.** for a ride. FRED (Free Ride Every Day) is the newest option for getting around downtown; a courtesy shuttle operated by the Downtown Norfolk Council. Basically a road-ready golf cart, FRED can carry as many as five passengers around downtown. - ▶ Ride The Tide Norfolk's light rail system that takes you from Eastern Virginia Medical College to Newtown Road that border's Virginia Beach. HRT 1 day go-passes are good for all Hampton Roads Transit transportation methods (includes the light rail, buses, and the ferry!). Passes can be purchased at the VisitNorfolk Visitor's Center at 232 E Main Street or at the light rail kiosks. www.gohrt.com
